Honors Sophomores Summer Reading 2024

Sophomores in the Honors Exploring Literature & Writing Class must read the following:

The Stranger in the Woods: The Extraordinary Story of the Last True Hermit by Michael Finkel

After reading, all sophomores must write an essay that answers the following prompt:

Prompt

Discuss the extent Knight goes through to remain a hermit. Did his childhood contribute to his future as a hermit? Why did Knight walk away from everything?

The requirements for the essay are as follows:

1. A five-paragraph (minimum) MLA formatted typed essay, including an introduction and conclusion.
2. A minimum of three quotations using proper MLA style in-text citation (Author pg #)
3. MLA Formatting including:
 - a. An MLA heading (your name, teacher's name, class name, due date)
 - b. Essay Title
 - c. A running header
 - d. A clear font no larger than size 12, with one-inch margins.
 - e. A readable 12-point font (Times New Roman or Calibri)
4. MLA formatted quotations with citations to support evidence throughout your essay.

Submission

Your essay must be submitted to Turnitin.com by the due date reviewed in class and posted on Moodle. You will bring a physical paper to class with you to class on the due date. Late work is not accepted.

Honors Juniors Summer Reading 2024

Juniors in the Honors American Literature must read the following:

Custer Died for your Sins: An Indian Manifesto by Jr. Vine Deloria

The Death of Jim Loney by James Welch

Walking the Rez Road by Jim Northrup

After reading, all juniors must write an essay that answers the following prompt:

After reading the assigned works; research the history of Native American reservations and the conditions of life on those reservations. Then draw connections between the three works and your research, analyzing the authors' perspectives on the state of Native American life.

The requirements for the essay are as follows:

- MLA format
- Minimum of 3 pages (not a 5-paragraph essay)
- Minimum of 1 outside source
- Minimum of 4 properly cited quotes (1 from each work and one from an outside source)
- Work Cited Page

Submission

Your essay must be submitted to Turnitin.com by the due date reviewed in class and posted on Moodle. You will bring a physical paper to class with you to class on the due date. Late work is not accepted.
