Central Catholic is motivated by a mission much larger than itself – a mission that has its origins in the Gospel. Over three centuries ago, Saint John Baptist de La Salle, inspired with a new vision of what a school could be, founded a religious order dedicated to teaching, that saw education as much more than just the transmission of information and skills. The school years were seen as an important and essential time in the life of boys as they grew into young men. The order he founded would become known as the Brothers of the Christian Schools.

Since 1927, Central Catholic has continued in this time-tested tradition of educating boys through a spirit of accompaniment, the unique Lasallian approach to education.

We meet your young teenager where he is, and journey with him as he discovers his God-given gifts and potential with a personalized and student-centered experience. Your son will be accompanied during the important high school years by highly qualified and caring teachers, Christian Brothers, counselors and coaches who view their work as a ministry and vocation.

Our Commitment to Your Son

As a college preparatory high school, we start with your son's future in mind. After four years at Central Catholic, your son is just beginning to realize what he is capable of. Our challenging curriculum and assortment of extra-curricular activities will prepare your son for the next phase of his life.

With our unique class offerings, four academic levels and over 65 electives, your son can explore his interests, and make a comfortable transition to a college environment. Having the freedom to explore topics like computer programming, songwriting, entrepreneurship, accounting, bioengineering, and more, will enable your son to make informed decisions early in his academic career.

In addition to a wide array of classes, students have access to a fully developed support system. Academic Support Services and the Bishop McDowell Program provide specialized resources to meet your son's individual needs. Central Catholic is a leader in academic support programming and other Lasallian high schools throughout the country are using Central Catholic's academic support programming as a model.

After four years at Central Catholic, students graduate well prepared for their futures. 95% of students in the Class of 2024 went on to a 2-year or 4-year college or university. With a full-time Director of College Counseling, your son will receive 1-on-1 guidance and support at every phase of his journey.

Our students matriculate to top colleges and universities, including Yale, Princeton, Harvard, Cornell, Carnegie Mellon, Notre Dame, the U.S. Naval Academy, West Point, Georgetown University, Howard University, University of Pittsburgh, Penn State University and Duquesne University. With Central Catholic graduates spread across the United States, you're never far from fellow alumni.

97% of Central Catholic graduates return for their sophomore year in college, compared to the national average of 75%.

Along with Central's outstanding academic curriculum, students are encouraged to explore intellectual challenges and enrich their curriculum through interdisciplinary programs like The Brother David S. Baginski, FSC Scholars Program.

The Scholars Program offers an engaging intellectual forum to highly motivated students. These students become part of a community of peers and faculty advisors, and meet regularly through seminars, mentoring, programmatic trips, symposia and a Senior Thesis project. At its core, the program is designed to encourage students to understand the intrinsic connections between their intellectual development and their responsibilities as global citizens.

To be admitted to the program, students complete an application and interview process in their sophomore year. Eligible sophomores must have taken a minimum of three AP or Honors courses and have demonstrated an ability to work at a minimum GPA level of 3.5. In addition, students should commit to three years of foreign language study and exhibit innovative ability, intellectual curiosity and interest in social causes.

A highlight of the Scholars Program is the cultural travel opportunity. In recent years, we have visited Boston, New York, Washington DC, Cleveland, Philadelphia and Chicago where we meet with distinguished university professors in a classroom setting and enter into dialogue on critical issues in their field.

Since 2017, the program has also offered a two-week study abroad opportunity. In 2024, the Scholars traveled to Hungary, Austria, and the Czech Republic.

The Engineering Institute



The goal of the Engineering Institute at Central Catholic (EICC) is to provide students opportunities, through a combination of coursework, resources and outside of the classroom experiences, to answer questions and allow them to make informed decisions about pursuing an engineering career.

EICC students will be engaged in an intellectually challenging, hands-on and relevant curriculum with coursework and experiences designed to foster creativity, problem-solving, teamwork and communication to give them exposure to engineering careers and prepare them for entry into a college engineering program.

Who should apply?

The EICC will be open to all 9th grade students who are interested in an engineering career. Students who have a diversity of skills, interests, backgrounds and abilities and who are interested in math and science, hands-on learning, creative problem solving and working together in teams are encouraged to apply. EICC students should have completed Honors or Advanced Geometry or will be enrolled in Honors or Advanced Geometry as a sophomore.

Students interested in the EICC will complete the application process during the second semester of their freshman year. Students accepted into the EICC program will register to take EICC-1 during their sophomore year and will begin with a seminar in the summer prior to the start of sophomore year.

Students accepted into the EICC will be part of a cohort that will complete the curricular requirements of the three-year program. EICC students will take a one-semester engineering course each of their sophomore, junior and senior years.

The focus of the senior year engineering class will be the completion of a capstone design project. EICC students are also required to take four years of math and science. Along with the EICC coursework, students will be involved in outside the classroom experiences that include guest speakers, seminars, field trips and collaboration with a professional mentor.

Academic Curriculum and Components:

- College-Prep Curriculum

With emphasis on Math and Science and will include critical thinking, public speaking and project-based learning skills.

- Math, Science and Engineering Coursework

Required courses in math (4) and science (4) as well as three semesters of engineering-specific coursework (EICC-1, EICC-2 and EICC-3).

- Taught by Engineers

With numerous years of real-world work experience in a variety of engineering field. . .

- Seminars and Enrichment Activities

Includes lectures, field trips and presentations outside of the classroom.

- Mentorship Opportunities

Students paired with engineering professionals to serve as a mentor.

- Capstone Project

Culminates the student's EICC experience and is the focus of the EICC-3 course taken senior year.

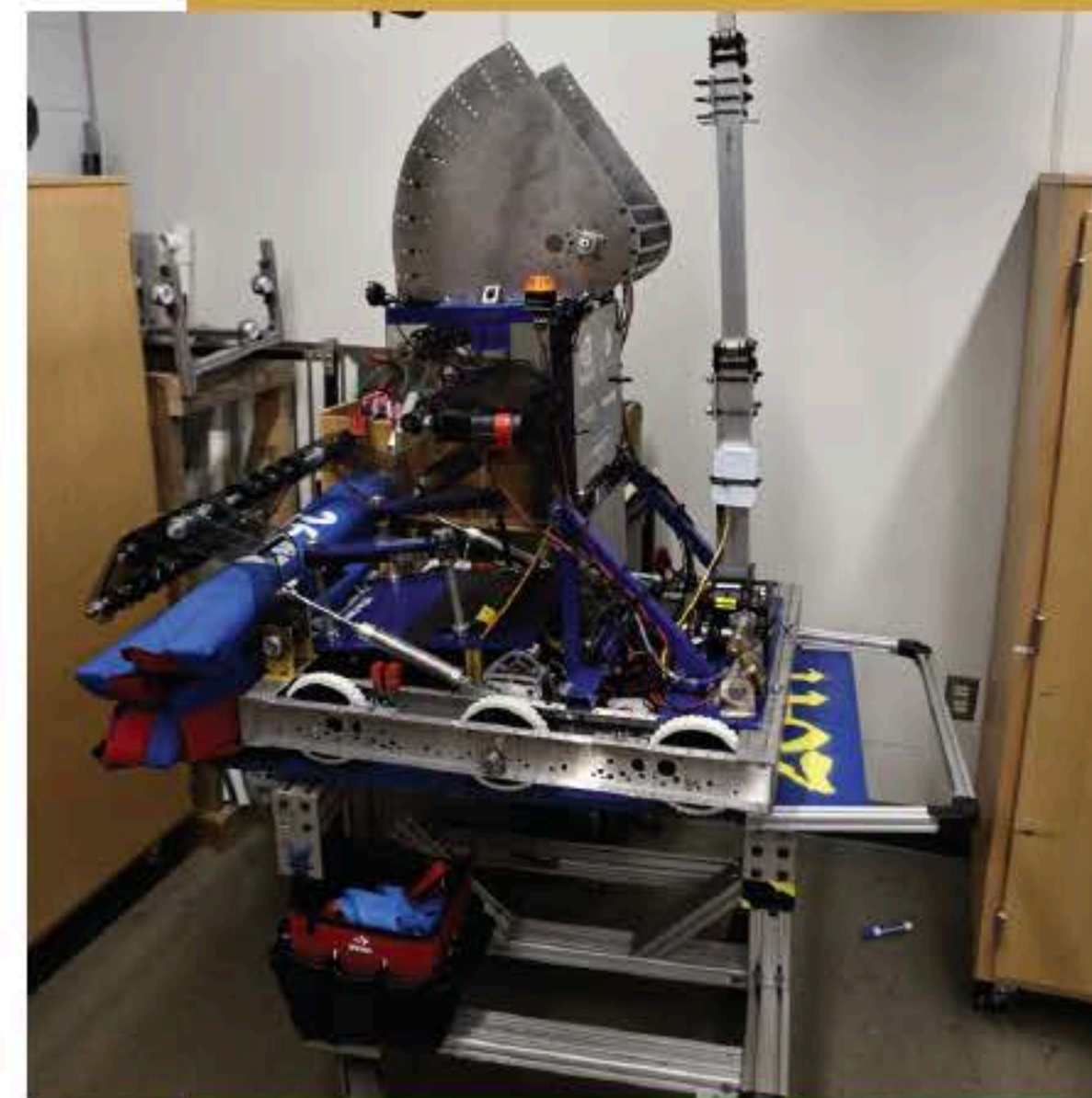

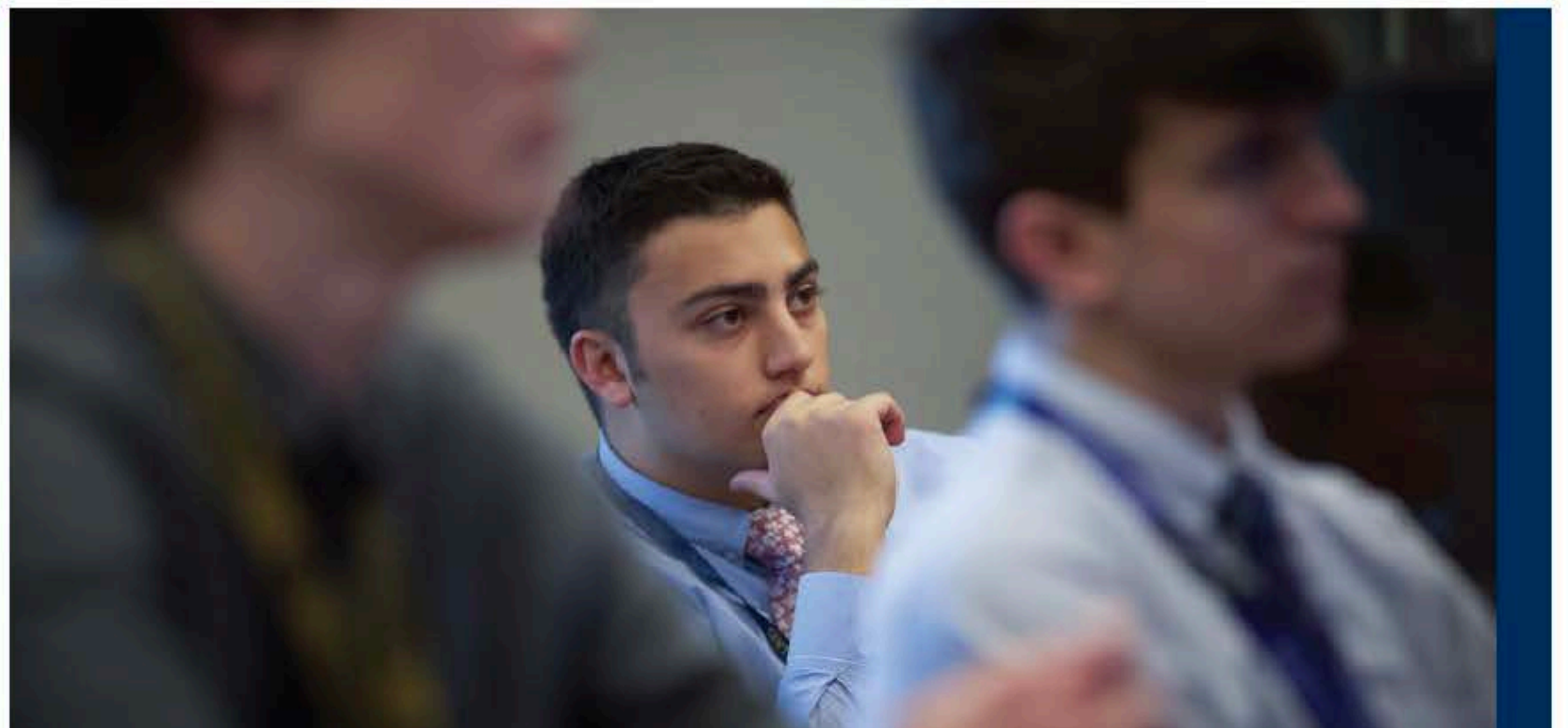

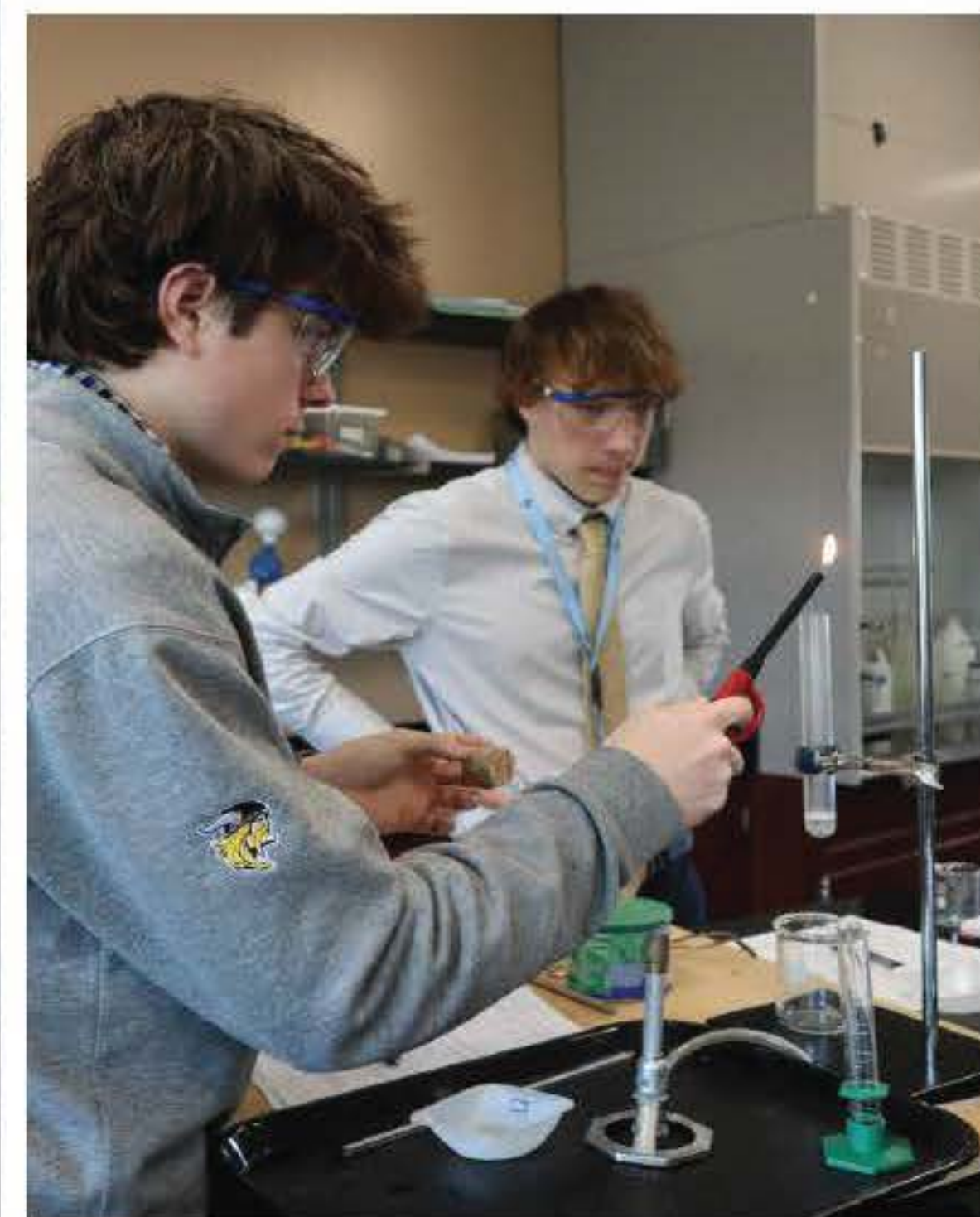
Academic Support

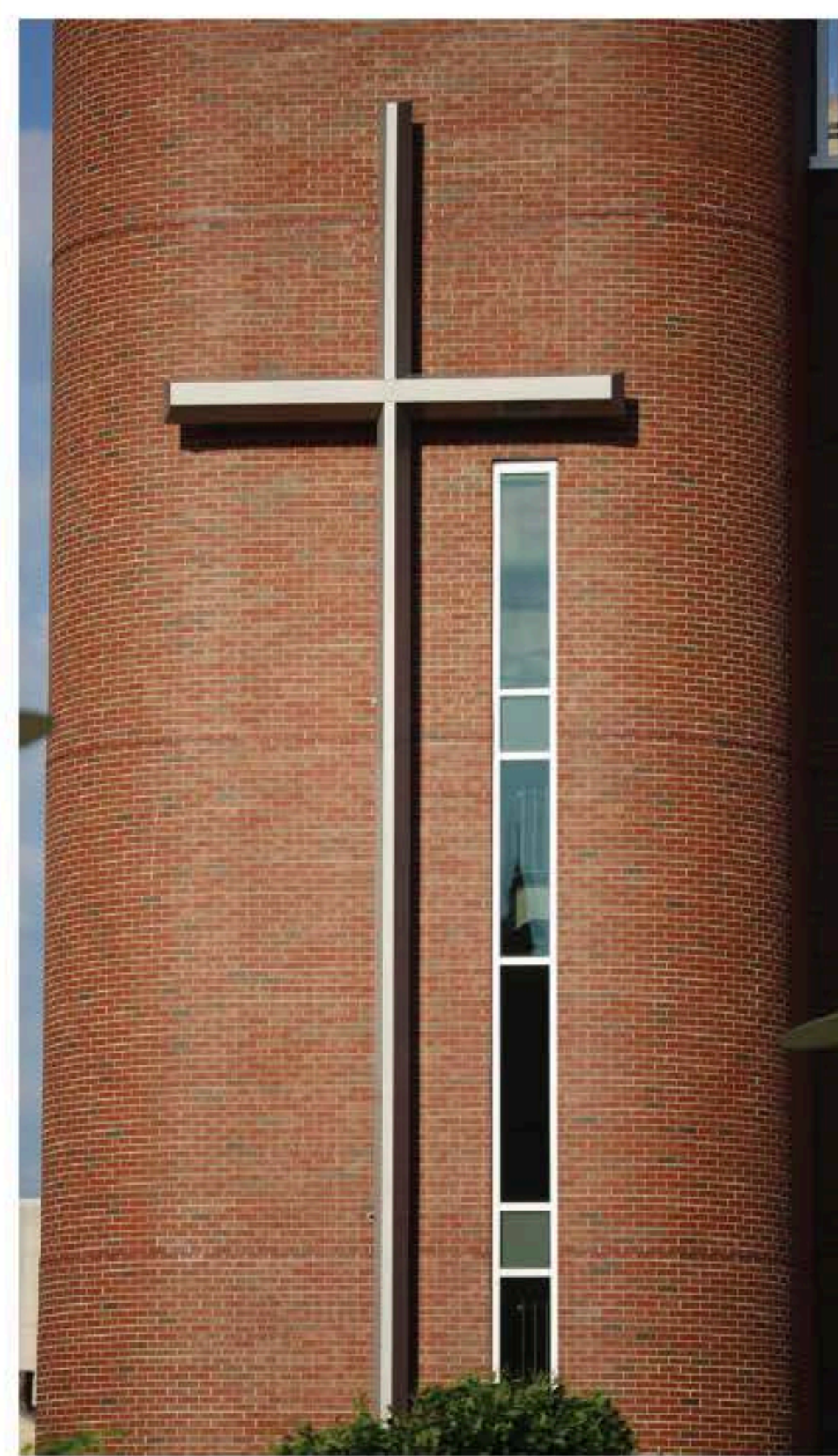

The Value of a Central Catholic Education

Financial aid

A Central Catholic education and all of the opportunities that come with it is a significant financial investment for many families, but it is also a significant investment in your son's future. We believe that Central Catholic is the premier high school in Western Pennsylvania for boys, but it is also the best dollar for dollar value in the Pittsburgh area's private education market.

Central Catholic High School is committed to keeping our program affordable and accessible to all who desire a faith based, college preparatory education. Therefore, financial aid is available for qualified families. Financial aid packages could include funds from a variety of sources including the Central Catholic Fund, the Bishop's Education Fund, the Opportunity Scholarship Tax Credit (OSTC) and the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) programs.

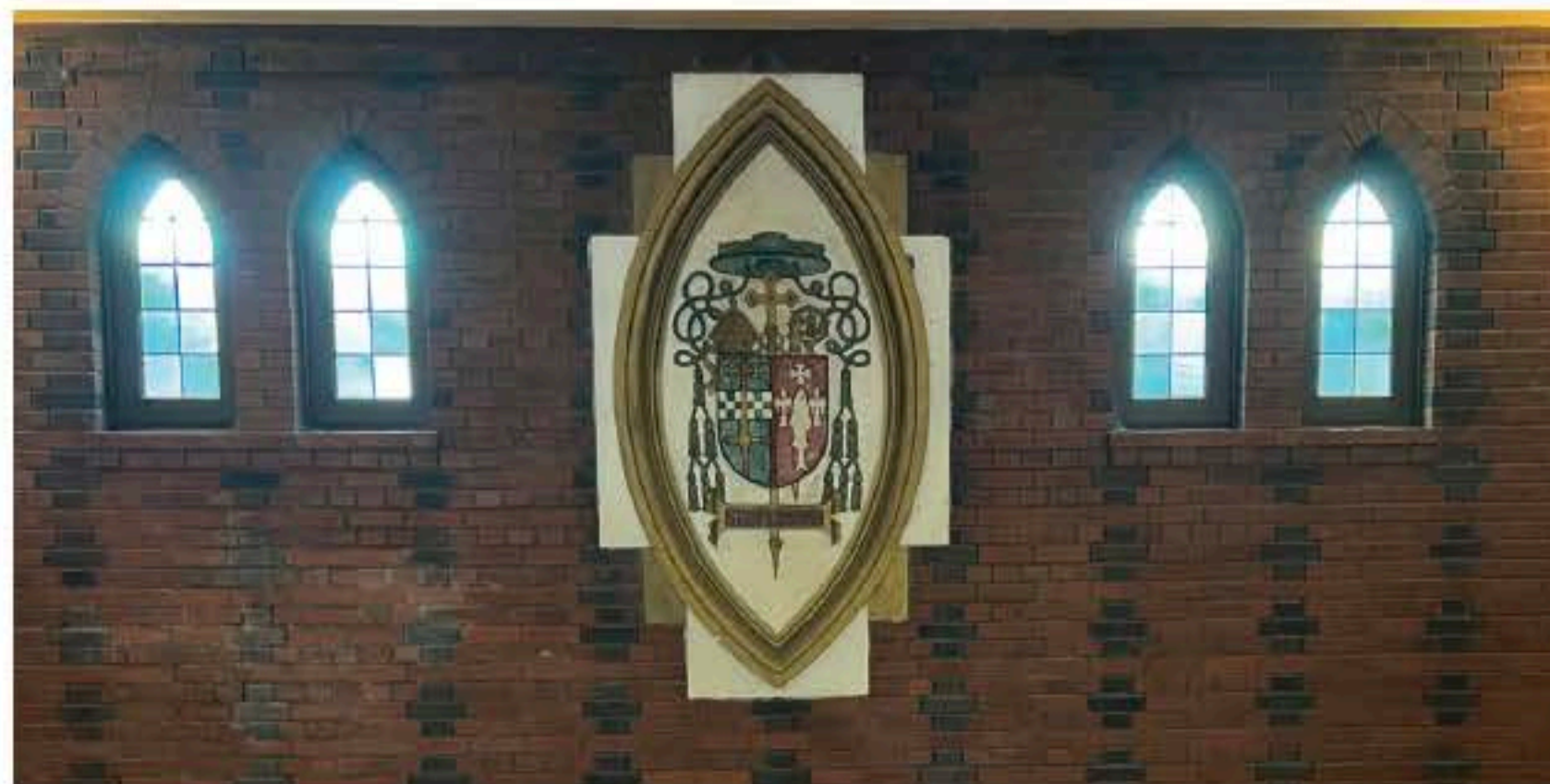
Central Catholic High School, historically, has been able to meet approximately 70% of a family's calculated need.

For the 2023 - 2024 school year, more than \$3.2 million was awarded to 350 families.

The Financial Aid Process

Families are asked to complete the FACTS Grant & Aid Application, which is available online in January. Your income tax documents will be required for completion of the FACTS Grant & Aid Application. The deadline for completion is March 15. Late applications will be accepted until the funds have been diminished. Financial aid awards will be announced in May.

If, after receiving an initial financial award, a family feels that their situation has changed or that certain extenuating circumstances were not accounted for in the FACTS Application, an appeal may be made in writing to the Central Catholic Financial Aid office.

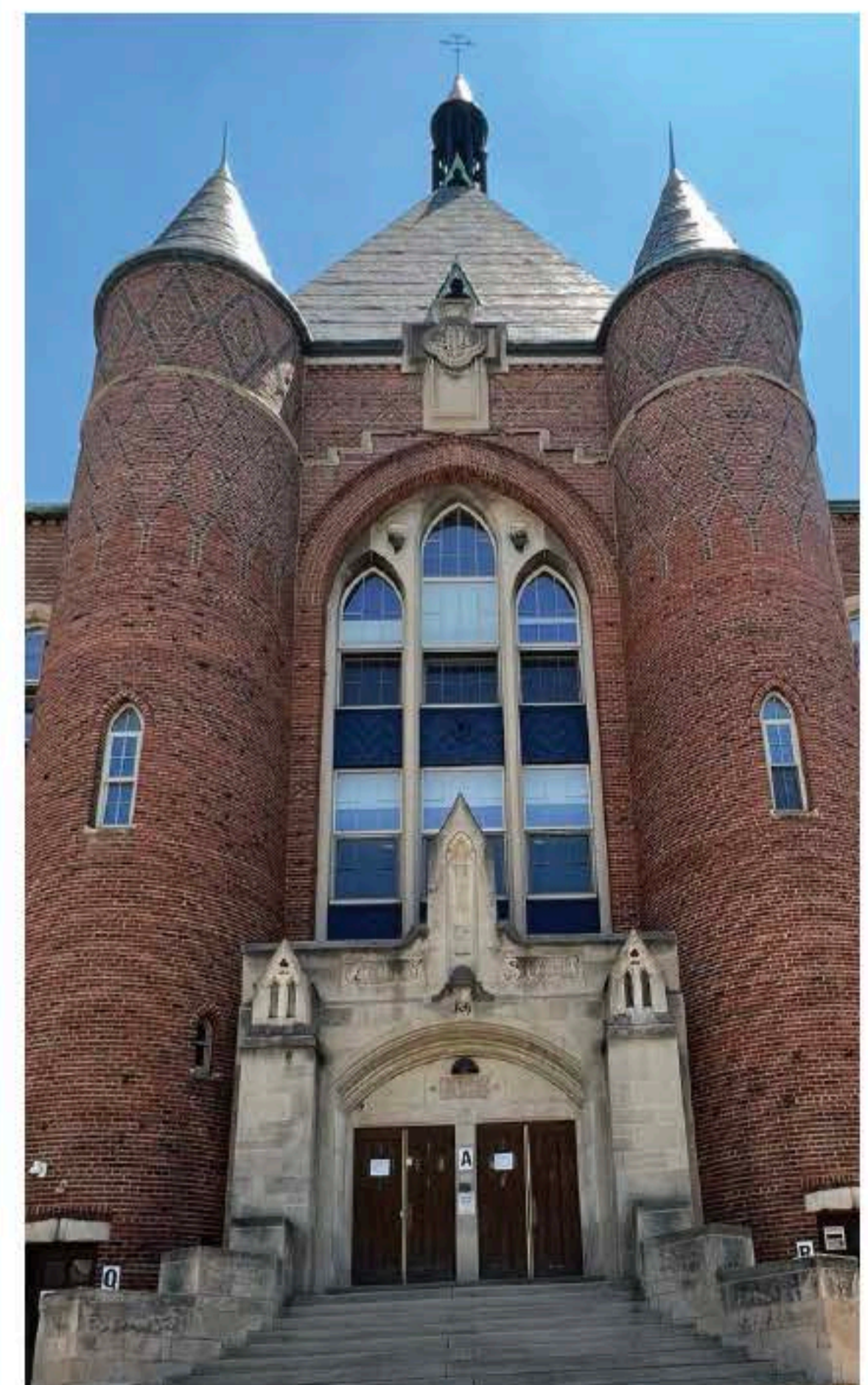

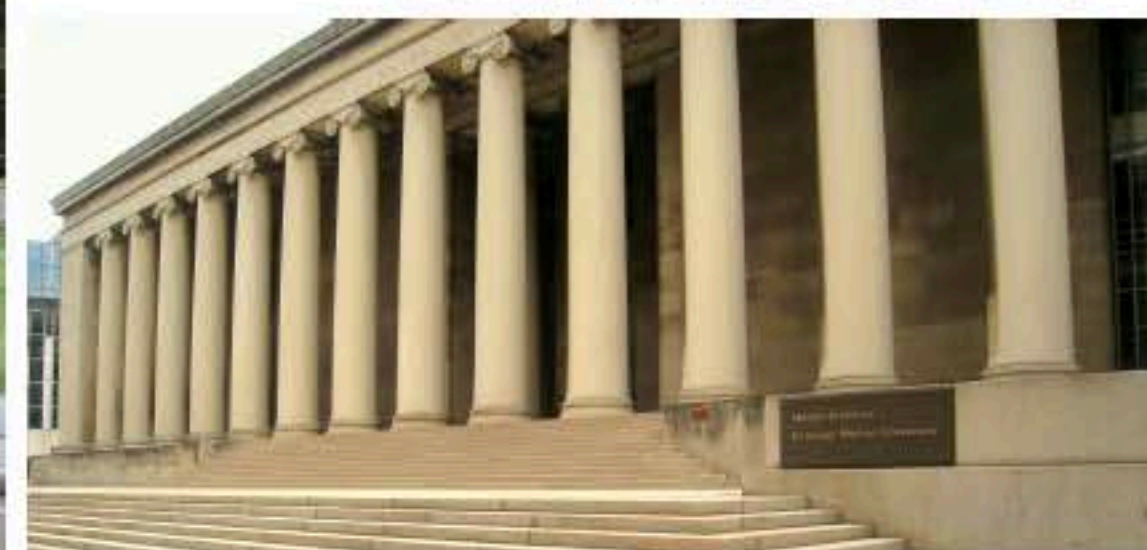
