Paul J. Sciullo II, '91, Scholarship Fund for First Responders

For decades, Central Catholic High School has valued the service and sacrifice of our community first responders. It is with great pride that we announce the formation of the *Paul J. Sciullo II, '91, Scholarship Fund for First Responders* for the sons of area law enforcement, fire, and emergency medical services.

The *Paul J. Sciullo II, '91, Scholarship Fund for First Responders* was established in honor and memory of Central Catholic High School alumnus Paul J. Sciullo II, '91. Paul was born and raised in Pittsburgh, attended Central Catholic High School, and served as a Pittsburgh Police Officer until his tragic and untimely death. On April 4th, 2009, Paul was killed in the line of duty along with fellow officers Eric Kelly and Stephen Mayhle.

It is with gratitude that Central Catholic can provide this scholarship opportunity to those young men whose parent(s) are actively serving the community as first responders. Central Catholic High School has a strong reputation for producing leaders and this is evident with the many who serve their community and country as public servants.

Families interested in applying for the scholarship must complete the application which will include information regarding the “full-time” service in the police, fire, or emergency medical services in the Pittsburgh region. Students will need to include a list of extracurricular activities, and any awards or achievements that he has earned. In addition, students will need write an essay explaining what their parent’s service means to them, as well as a letter of recommendation from a teacher, administrator, or community leader. Parents must produce proof of employment as a full-time first responder.

Applications are due no later than January 1, 2025.
