Jack Twyman, '51, Leadership Scholarship

At Central Catholic, we are committed to developing the young men entrusted to our care into strong and confident leaders in the community. Many young men display their leadership potential early on, even in grade school and middle school. It is these young men that we invite to apply for the *Jack Twyman, '51, Leadership Scholarship*.

The *Jack Twyman, '51, Leadership Scholarship* will be awarded to students who have demonstrated the potential to be leaders in their communities. This can range from the student's classroom to their extracurricular activity or sport to their faith community. Students who display these skills in their younger years should be afforded the opportunity to develop these skills and to be guided to become strong and confident leaders in the years to come. Central Catholic aims to provide these opportunities for all our students, but we would like to reward those who come to us having demonstrated these skills.

All applications will be reviewed by a group of teachers and administrators and students will be notified if they have received the scholarship when they receive notification of their admission to Central Catholic in February. Our *Jack Twyman, '51, Leadership Scholarship* recipients will receive up to a \$6,000 annual scholarship for each of their four years at Central Catholic, provided, they maintain a minimum 3.2 unweighted GPA each semester and do not exceed 25 conducts points for the school year. GPAs will be reviewed at the end of each semester. Anyone who does not meet the minimum 3.2 unweighted GPA will be placed on a one-semester probation. Failure to raise the GPA will result in the scholarship being lost at the end of the academic year.

Students who are interested in applying for this scholarship must fill out an application which will include a list of extracurricular activities and any awards or achievements that he has earned. In addition, students must also get a letter of recommendation from a teacher, administrator, faith leader, or community leader and write an essay that describes his leadership abilities and how he will contribute to Central Catholic's mission of producing Men of Faith, Scholarship, and Service.

Letters of Recommendations and Applications are due no later than January 1, 2025.
